Course Description

Students will learn the three aspects of academia:

1. Career – Finding/ understanding future teaching/ administrative/ clinical opportunities inside and pharmacy academia and other.
2. Teaching – Teaching in residency as an instructor/ preceptor, developing a potential residency abstract and teaching philosophy. An active participant and leader in preparing and presenting lectures, syllabi, quiz and exam questions, preparing lab equipment, grading assignments, evaluating course curricula.
3. Scholarship – Involved with reading, reviewing, revising, and writing submissions for publication.
4. Service - Honors admissions evaluations, serving as a resource for best practices to peer faculty especially as it relates to online and face-to-face teaching.
